Volunteering SA&NT has had a mighty year! Despite COVID-19 pandemic restrictions, we welcomed 88 new members, supported 1255 VIOs and 17,126 volunteers, ran 21 successful programs and contributed to many sector projects.

Interest in our online training and networks has grown and the number of resources available on our website has increased significantly.

In November 2020, the NT Volunteer of the Year Awards were celebrated, with 141 people nominating and 12 winning Awards.

In May 2021, we recognised the amazing efforts of many volunteers with more than 1647 organisations during National Volunteer Week (NVW). In Adelaide, we held our popular Thank You Parade in the CBD, and in Alice Springs and Darwin we held two celebratory recognition events for 312 people. We were pleased to bring back the #colouryourcommunityred online campaign with homes, businesses and offices decorated in red, and pictures and videos posted on social media.

The NVW theme of **Recognise. Reconnect. Reimagine.** acknowledges the vital role of volunteers, especially during the uncertainty and disruption around the pandemic.

These are examples of uplifting and positive events, however most organisations are facing a volunteer shortage. Celebrations highlight the importance of volunteers and their vital work across communities.

Now we need to work together, to reinvigorate volunteering and find innovative ways around flexibility, innovation and openness.

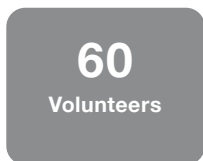
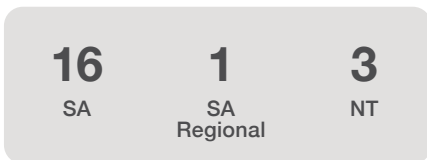
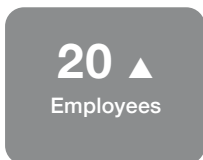
