"There are so many positions available right now with some great organisations.

"And they are readily available on our FREE WeDo App, downloaded through Google Play or Apple, and on our website.

"You can search for your favourite charity or not-for-profit organisation, or select key words to find the positions you are interested in," Ms Fox said.

If you are a first-time volunteer or don't know where to start, then Volunteering SA&NT offers a one-on-one matching service through their Volunteer ASSIST program.

When you volunteer, you make a difference in somebody else's life, and improve yours by doing something positive and worthwhile in the community.
