Joining the annual National Volunteer Week festivities is one of Australia's most loved performers RICKI-LEE who will join local star, Rachael Leahcar for an acoustic performance at the free lunch-time concert in Victoria Square. Other volunteer supporters on the day will be the Premier of South Australia, Peter Malinauskas, Lord Mayor of Adelaide, Sandy Verschoor and the Governor of South Australia, and Patron of Volunteering SA&NT, Frances Adamson.

A gourmet BBQ is also on offer following the 11 am Parade which starts from the Torrens Parade Ground.

Hamilton Calder, CEO Volunteering SA&NT said that there has been more than 900 registrations to date, with the hope to double that number - to make it the biggest and best one yet.

"Although we thank our volunteers each and every day of the year, we want to shout if from the roof tops, we want to celebrate the dedicated individuals who make such a difference in the community, and to the people they support," said Mr Calder.
