Caleb joined St John as a cadet about six years ago, bringing with him immense enthusiasm. Since then, he has completed his leadership training and actively mentors younger members, assisting with their training. Our junior cadets admire Caleb and frequently seek his guidance. He approaches every situation with maturity and is not hesitant to ask for help when needed. Being calm and friendly, Caleb excels in patient care and embodies the spirit of teamwork.

#### **Leah Driver**

Leah started as a Junior with St John Ambulance 9 years ago. Leah's enthusiasm and willingness to learn has been exceptional. Leah has had the most event hours for cadets in Alice Springs for the past 2 years, and has also been awarded this in previous years. Leah completed leadership training and is now a cadet sergeant. Leah is also a volunteer at Speedway and Finke. Her commitment goes above and beyond in whatever she does.

# **Excellence in Volunteer Management Award**

#### **Finalists**

#### **Bridget Shelton**

Bridget joined the Red Cross as a volunteer in 2022. Her greatest achievements include managing over 140 volunteers across Central Australia, Darwin, and Katherine, and playing a key role in volunteer recruitment and capacity building. Bridget's role in stakeholder coordination, volunteer recruitment, capacity building, and mobilisation has been crucial, especially during high-stakes situations in the Northern Territory.

Bridget actively supported the Incident Management Team during multiple emergency activations and post-Cyclone Outreach, as well as assisting in the creation of the Sentiment report submitted to Government.

#### **Katie Thompson**

Katie Thompson has shown unwavering commitment and dedication to the West Macs Monster event over several years, wearing multiple hats as a volunteer, participant, and volunteer coordinator on the committee.

She coordinates around 100 volunteers each year for this multi-day race in Central Australia, overseeing logistics, manages aid stations, assigns trail sweepers, and ensures the safety and success of hundreds of runners, crew members, and spectators. Katie also provides safety training for volunteers and her energy, reliability, and heartfelt dedication make her an indispensable part of the West Macs Monster and a vital member of the community she serves.

#### Renecia Maneveldt

Renecia manages the library volunteers in the Read Write Chat and Books on Wheels programs. During Renecia's time working with the volunteers, the programs have tripled in numbers of volunteers. This has allowed more participants throughout the community, many from diverse backgrounds, to have their lives improved.

### INPEX Emergency Services Volunteer of the Year Award

#### **John Wright**

John has been a very active and valued member of the NTES Tennant Creek Volunteer Unit since 2013 where he currently is the appointed Unit Officer. In this role, John ensures that the Volunteer unit's operational readiness and resources are maintained. He manages a small but very enthusiastic volunteer base and as John often puts in the extra hours undertaking this role, this has meant that the unit's main capabilities have been maintained for community effectiveness to a high standard. John is also an active member of the Tennant Creek Local Emergency Committee.

#### **Kathryn Cooper**

Kathryn has been a volunteer with St John Ambulance for almost 10 years. Her contribution has been invaluable. During COVID Kathryn gave just over 199 voluntary hours to ambulance crew with the decontamination of ambulances and assisting crews where needed. Kathryn puts in a substantial amount of volunteer hours each year and assists regularly at a number of events in town. Kathryn will always do what she can to help her community.

#### **Katherine Lyons-Dawson**

Kate joined the Australian Red Cross as an Emergency Services volunteer in 2022 and has since excelled in leading teams to create safe and supportive environments for individuals and families displaced by emergencies. Her ability to manage complex situations and lead by example has had a profound impact on both her colleagues and the communities she serves. As an evacuation centre Manager, Kate has been instrumental in improving the efficiency and effectiveness of emergency response operations.

#### The Alice Springs Volunteer Bushfire Brigades

The Alice Springs Volunteer Bushfire Brigades (ASVBB) work with landowners and the wider community to protect lives, property and the environment from the threat of wildfire in and around our end of the Northern Territory (NT). The brigade also participates in many Central Australian events including the provision of fire support and volunteer services to many of our local events.

#### **West Macs Monster Event**

The West Macs Monster volunteers are a cast of hundreds of ordinary people who donate hours, sometimes days and weeks of their time to the organisation and running of this iconic trail running event. The event has been running for 6 years, gaining in popularity and numbers each year.

#### **Women's Museum of Australia**

Our Volunteer team at WMoA have shown long-term dedication to serving the community. Our Volunteer team play a crucial role in preserving and showcasing the place of women in Australia's history. This has led to a tangible increase in the documentation and recognition of women's achievements, contributing to a more comprehensive understanding of women's roles in society. They help with different initiatives aimed at preserving and promoting both the WMoA and Old Gaol and have been instrumental in gaining the Museum in 2019 the title of National Museum of Significance by the National Library of Australia.

#### **Maggie Johnson**

Maggie has made a remarkable impact as a volunteer at Rovers Football Club. She coaches the female under-17 team, plays for the senior women's side, and serves as a general committee member. Maggie holds a pivotal role as a general committee member of Rovers Football Club and spearheads initiatives as the lead of the Rovers Football Club Social Committee. Maggie drives initiatives that enhance both the sporting and social aspects of the club. Her efforts have boosted team performance and strengthened the club's community atmosphere, making her a respected and well-liked figure.

## **Chief Minister's Volunteer of the Year Award**

#### **Finalists**

#### Januma (Mona) Ulak

Over the past 15 years in Alice Springs, Mona has volunteered in various roles as the Chairperson of Multicultural Community Services Central Australia since 2021 and helped shape the migrant settlement policy. She also served as a Multicultural Community Representative on the Ministerial Advisory Council for Multicultural Affairs (2019-2022). Mona has chaired BDOIH for the past 3 years, overseeing its growth as a major cultural event with over 2,000 attendees annually.

Since 2015, Mona has been the founder and Chairperson of Nepalese Community Alice Springs NCAS, a community hub with over 1,000 members, organising cultural and community events. Her contributions are leaving a lasting mark on Central Australia's multicultural landscape.

#### Jennifer Hamilton

Jen has been a volunteer Deputy Captain with the Alice Springs Volunteer Bushfire Brigade for the past 4 years, a Fundraiser for Legacy Australia since 2014, a Board Member at the Central Australian Women's Legal Service (Human Rights), a Foster Parent with Foster and Kinship Carers Association NT, and an Ambassador with White Ribbon Australia since 2012. Her most valuable contributions include fostering strong relationships with landholders, Traditional Custodians, and conservation stakeholders like Flora and Fauna, and Parks. Known for her leadership and mentorship. Jen's former Captain described her as an "incredible leader" who genuinely loves helping others and is a significant asset to the Alice Springs community.

#### **Norelle Clark**

Norelle has shown a long-standing commitment and leadership across various organisations: 15 years with Girl Guides Australia fostering youth development, 7 years with the Australian Red Cross running community and hospital programs, 3 years as Junior Coach and Team Manager for Northern Territory Tenpin Bowling, and 2 years with the American Red Cross supporting school programs and disaster relief. Since returning to Alice Springs in 2022, her most notable achievement is introducing Pickleball to the community, investing \$2,000 of her own funds and over 20 volunteer hours per week to establish and grow the sport, making her the face of Pickleball in the region.
